### Notes:

- 1     *The first version is best! By all means start with the simple version but you will get so much more pleasure and satisfaction from mastering the other one. It will be worth the effort!*
- 2     *In the full version, look at the chord chart at the bottom of the page. Notice the pattern of the chords. In most cases, you will do 4 strums per chord but even when this is only 2 (eg Dm / G7 / ) it is very regular and logical.*
